

The Pasadena Community Orchestra is pleased to announce the start of its 2023-2024 free concert series and its 41st year as a community orchestra. All of our concerts are free to the public. The first four concerts are held at the beautiful Pasadena First Church of the Nazarene starting at 8:00 p.m. with lots of free parking and handicapped access. Please mark in your calendars the below concert dates.

Last year's 40th Anniversary Season was magical in so many way. We dubbed it the "Season of Youth" despite our age! Why? We featured our 2020 and 2021 Young Artist Competition winners who were unable to perform because of the pandemic in addition to the 2022-2023 season winner. All three performed with the fearlessness and enthusiasm of their youth and were rewarded with standing ovations by our growing post-pandemic audiences. This magic continued...we honored our founding conductor, Wayne Reinecke, who began our orchestra in 1982 with the help of local musicians. We also honored our current musical director Bethany Pflueger for her 10th anniversary with PCO. Under her tutelage, she has attracted new musicians of all ages and

we are playing at full strength with a waiting list of musicians eligible to join. Maestro Pflueger has challenged our performers with a wide range of both popular classical pieces, new compositions by emerging composers, and women composers of the classical era. Our 2023 Concert in the Park hosted PCO's largest audience to date and largest ever for our park concert.
